#### **Third Quarter Learning Goals**

#### Math Goals:

- Count to 50
- Count by 10's to 100
- Writes and identifies numbers 0 to 20
- Count on from a given number 1-50
  - o I say "43", you say "44, 45, 46"
- Identifies solid shapes (3D)
  - o cube, sphere, cylinder, and cone
- Identifies and sorts shapes as flat or solid shapes
- Describes objects using names of shapes
- Builds and draws shapes
- Add and subtract to 10 with manipulatives, pictures, and equations
- Solves word problems whose sum/difference is less than or equal to 10

#### Reading Goals:

- Recognize rhyming words
  - O bat/cat rhyme?
- Produce rhyming words
  - **Output** What rhymes with pan?
- Read 40 high frequency words
- Print upper and lower case letters
- Blend and segment onsets and rimes
  - $\circ \quad \mathbf{c-at} = \mathbf{cat}, \, \mathbf{dog} = \mathbf{d-og}$
- Isolate and pronounce the initial, medial vowel, and finals sounds in CVC words.
  - $\circ$  p-i-g = pig
- Actively enage in group reading activities
- Draw and write to compose informative, opinion, and narrative text about a book or topic
- Capitalize the first word in a sentence
- Recognize end punctuation
